JCM's own Clemens Quartet to be broadcast nationally the week of December 1 on From the Top!

I had the pleasure of catching the Clemens Quartet before a rehearsal last week to talk to them about their experience as a featured guest on *From the Top*, a national radio show hosted by Christopher O'Riley. This wildly popular radio show "celebrates"

the amazing performances and captivating stories of extraordinary young classical musicians" as described on the show's website.

The Clemens Quartet is comprised of KJ McDonald and Jason Corbin, violins, Patrick Marsh, viola and Alex Mansour, cello. The quartet was formed originally "randomly" through JCM but their chemistry and ensemble seemed to work. "The group have many things in common: all four are energetic, love new music, are composers themselves, and most importantly are passionate about chamber music and it's wonderful social aspects" explained Lorenz Gamma, their coach. After their original cellist graduated, Alex came on board. They have bonded through their experiences competing in the Fischoff Competition, from their years with JCM and "eating pizza for 45 minutes straight" before rehearsals, according to their coach.


When talking with the quartet, one immediately notices that they speak with a unanimity of purpose and passion that one can only imagine is mirrored in their playing. The *From the Top* taping took place at the University of Connecticut in front of a large live audience of over 1000 people, but the sizable audience did not seem to phase the seasoned quartet. They said it really felt like another concert to share the music and try to connect with the audience. They played Bartok Quartet and really wanted this music to come alive and to share the story of the music with the audience. Their coach Mr. Gamma added, "the group's playing reached a new level of precision after everybody on the show realized that on the radio

you can't rely on your good looks... "

Prior to the taping, the quartet performed outreach concerts at local schools, which was a highlight of their trip. They came away with a new perspective on the connective power of music that they wish to develop in their future performances and in outreach to underserved communities. They also enjoyed immensely the chance to meet the other performers on the show and to share ideas about how they can better convey their passion for music to their audiences.

The Clemens Quartet name is taken from the real name of Mark Twain--Sam Clemens. When in Connecticut they also had the chance to visit the Mark Twain House and Museum. "The Clemens Quartet were at the Clemens' house!" Kyoko McDonald, mother of KJ explained.
